

NEW DAN LOCKLAIR CD



Dan Locklair has a wonderful new CD available. Loft Recordings has issued **The Music of Dan Locklair** (LRCD-1110), a collection of some of the composer's finest organ music, performed by the internationally renowned Marilyn Keiser.

Selections on the disk are **Rubrics** (A Liturgical Suite for Organ) [1988], **Salem Sonata** for organ [2003], **PHOENIX Processional** (Solo Organ Version) [1996 from **PHOENIX Fanfare and Processional**) [1979/85], **Celebration** (Variations for Organ) [2003], **The** *Æ***olian Sonata** for organ [2002] and **In Mystery and Wonder** (The Casavant Diptych) [2004].

DAN LOCKLAIR IN THE CONCERT HALL

Recent performances of Dan Locklair's music have included:

changing perceptions, a five-movement choral cycle for SATB chorus and piano was performed by the Akron Symphony Chorus, Hugh Ferguson Floyd conductor, as part of their Spring Concert on March 14 at Our Lady of the Elms in Akron, Ohio.

Stirring the Silence was performed by the Providence Singers, Andrew Clark, Artistic Director, on March 6 at the VMA Arts and Cultural Center, in Providence, Rhode Island. The concert was recorded by WGBH radio in Boston for future broadcast.



Locklair's new **Preces** and **Responses** were sung for the first time by the St. Thomas Choir of Men and Boys (John Scott, Organist and Director of Music) of St. Thomas Church on Fifth

Avenue in NY City on Feb. 9, 10 and 14.

In Mystery and Wonder (The Casavant Diptych) was performed by Dr. Marilyn Keiser on October 20 as part of her Great Organ: Great Artist series recital at the Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine in Manhattan.

The World Premiere of Dan Locklair's new anthem for SATB chorus, *a cappella*, **In the Sight of God**, was performed by the Saint Thomas Choir of Men and Boys at their services on October 4 at Saint Thomas Church in Manhattan.

The Choir also presented his **Magnificat** and **Nunc Dimittis** (Montréal) for SATB (divisi) and organ at their choral evensong service on November 18 at Saint Thomas.

Upcoming performances include:

The Boston Gay Men's Chorus will perform Locklair's **Freedom** (for TTBB Chorus and Piano) on words by Maya Angelou on March 27 and 28 in Jordan Hall (part of New England Conservatory).

Dream Steps (A Dance Suite for Flute, Viola and Harp) will be performed on April 11 at the Weymouth Center in Southern Pines, N.C. Performers will be Laura Gilbert, flute (of the Aureole Trio), Jonathan Bagg, viola and Jacqueline Bartlett, harp.

Sonata da chiesa for flute and organ will be performed on May 31 at Grace Church in Charleston, S.C as part of the 2010 Piccolo Spoleto Festival. The flutist is Jessica Hull-Dambaugh, principal flutist in the Charleston Symphony Orchestra and the organist is Greg Homza.
